Vocational education in Portugal is designed for students who prefer a more practical, labor-market-oriented path. Its goal is to provide specific skills and facilitate the transition to employment or further studies.





















The National Qualifications Catalog

It's a strategic management tool for non-higher education qualifications. Is a dynamic tool for the strategic management of non-tertiary qualifications, integrated in the National Qualifications System, and regulates the offer of dual certification training (school and professional).

- Young: To complete basic education and secondary education through a more practical learning, associated with a profession
- Adults: There are several qualification pathways that, throughout life, allow you to obtain a school certification at a basic or secondary level and/or a professional certification
- Entities: Public or Private

The NQc includes 274 qualifications for 39 areas of education and training:

- 114 confer the NQF qualification level 2 (includes 9th year)
- 125 confer the NQF qualification level 4 (includes 12th year)
- 35 confer the NQF qualification level 5 (includes 12th year)

The qualifications that make up the Catalog are organized into areas of education and training, presenting for each qualification:

- A professional profile: know-how and know-how needed to carry out the activities
- A training benchmark: short-term training units
